
JUNIOR SPORTS DAY - 26 July 2022




Brand Wars:

Fascinating Aspect of Education

One has the best chance of actually progressing, if started with the most basic aspect of the subject matter.

Ironically, the earlier education system never had this and it was a major red flag. Like the individuals didn't want pupils to learn swimming from the lower end, rather wanted them to swim in the deep end of the pool. Such as there was a thing like teaching children advanced math in second grade, this was referred in the early claims of New Math, around 1962. One might have seen earlier education system boasting about it. But the mere truth is, the students never even learned basic math because of the complexity of advanced maths had caused confusion to their brains and were unable to think or learn simple math.On the other hand, the Common Core subjects followed the much-needed pattern of stagewise learning to keep it basic. Because of its simplicity and progressive stage of learning. Common Core learning pattern was adopted by many education systems.

One may or may not be familiar with this learning theory, however all pupils adhered to the Common Core academic requirements from kindergarten to high school. At the beginning, subjects like English Language Arts, Mathematics were covered in this theory. Kentucky was the first state in The US to implement Common Core. "The secret is to start with the simplest elements and work the way up from there". Here's how it does: At whatever cost, a pupil requires a momentum and should not fail, especially at the beginning. Surrounded by positivity of happiness, enthusiasm, confidence etc., helps them advance the most. The Common Core method may take more time, but that is the only mirage, since the alternate strategy never goes very far.









Is this what growing up is supposed to be like?

Remember back when you were a kid? You would just do things. You never thought to yourself, "What are the relative advantages of learning cricket versus football?" You just ran to the playground and played.Nobody told you to do it, you just did it. You were led merely by curiosity and excitement.
